Dear Parent/Guardian

I welcome you to the 2021-22 academic year, and hope your son has had an enjoyable first week back at school.

A major part of the success of our boys over the last four years is the support from parents, and a positive home environment. Additionally, a strong partnership between the school and yourself continues to make a great difference in your son's education and progress. Parents, staff and Governors share the responsibility for ensuring pupils succeed and I want to assure you that we will do our very best to fulfil our responsibilities.

To help ensure the future success of your son, please would you help, guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he:

1. Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready to learn. When you make school attendance a priority, you help your son get better grades, develop healthy habits and avoid dangerous behaviour. DFE research show that 78% of students who have no absences achieve five or more A*-C grades. This falls to 35% for those students 10% absence. Boys who attend school regularly also feel more connected to their peers and their community, encouraging healthy friendships and relationships.
2. Be appropriately organised, always bringing correct equipment. Anyone not bringing appropriate equipment will be given an X.
3. Display high expectations and have a positive attitude to study. It is very important that we all have high expectations of your son and that he knows the value of hard work.
4. Contribute to the school community and the school's respectful school culture.
5. Adhere to the school's 'Good Manners Program' and understand basic values and "golden rules" such as: *"We are gentle, we are kind, we work hard, we look after property, we listen to people, we are honest, we do not hurt anybody."*
6. Completes all homework assignments given by teachers. Anyone not completing homework to a satisfactory standard will be given an X. You can check what homework has been set on showmyhomework and in his journal.

I will remind you of a few of the school rules: mobile telephones are not allowed under any circumstances, but pupils will always be allowed to phone home from the school office in emergencies; hairstyles should be conventional, not exaggerated, lined or coloured; uniform should be worn correctly to, from and at school; pupils are not allowed to chew gum, or bring chewing gum into school; if they do this will result in a Saturday detention.
