## MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continuing support of the school at this difficult time. I would also like to remind you of the advice I have previously given about Coronavirus, and to update you on new developments. It is very important that the boys wash their hands regularly, with soap and hot water, and the school has ample toilet facilities and sinks to enable the boys to do this. Public Health England guidance is that masks and gloves are not advised and can often cause additional problems. Therefore, these are not to be worn in school.

I would also like to clarify our procedures with regard to pupil absence. In light of the government's most recent announcements, your child may present with the following symptoms: **a new cough and/or a high temperature**. In this circumstance, and **only in this circumstance**, the government is currently advising that your child should stay at home for seven days and follow the government advice on self-isolation. This will be an 'authorised absence'. You must confirm this by calling the school on the absence line. It is not enough to say that your child is sick. Please confirm their symptoms.

It is very important, in the meantime, that school continues as normal and I expect all fit and healthy pupils to be in for their normal school day, extra sessions and detentions. It goes without saying that we will continue to follow the advice of the Department for Education, and Public Health, and I kindly and respectfully ask that you do the same.

Lord Jesus, you came into the world to heal our infirmities and to endure our sufferings. You went about healing all and bringing comfort to those in pain and need. We come before you now in this time of illness asking that you may be the source of our strength in body, courage in spirit and patience in pain. May we join ourselves more closely to you on the cross and in your suffering that through them we may draw our patience and hope. Assist us and restore us to health so that united more closely to your family, the Church, we may give praise and honour to your name.


## Y11 MOCK EXAM TIMETABLE
