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Subject Name: Art & Design

Year	7
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Number of lessons/	1 Lesson per week
homework per week	Homework will be set on a weekly basis. This will build on what they have learnt in lesson, and include challenges to deeply analyse and evaluate their own work, or the work of others. Observational drawing opportunities will be built into the scheme of homework.
Key skills required to complete this course:	Students will be required to learn how to analyse an Artwork after looking at the context of the Artwork, and the Artist, in relation to the current topic. Students will also be required to demonstrate their understanding of drawing methods and rendering through skills such as drawing, painting, collage, sculpture and other design based activities.

Topics covered throughout this term:	Pupils will study The Elements of Art through a variety of materials and through looking at other Artists' work, both historical and modern. This project is designed to improve their drawing skills and knowledge of the elements.
	Materials students will study include colour pencil, graphic pencil, collage, and inks.
	Students will study the work of Van Gogh and Alison Lapper, before looking at the origins of drawing, purpose of drawing and drawing through other cultures such as in African Patterns.
Assessment details: internal assessment during Autumn 2022	Each term, students will receive two assessments and grades. The first will be based on a skill displayed in a single piece of work, set by the department. The second will be a whole project assessment considering their overall skills, contextual research, experimentation and design choices. These assessments will respond to their knowledge and understanding of how an Artist works; how a material can be manipulated; the recording skills students have studied; and how to produce a personal and meaningful response to the topic.








Subject Name: **Drama**

Number of lessons/ homework per week	1 Lesson per week Homework will be set on a weekly basis. This will build on what they have learnt in lesson and include challenges to deeply analyse and evaluate their own work.
Key skills required to complete this course:	Those who are most successful in Drama are those who are able to think creatively; this skill will be developed throughout the course. Students also need to be reflective about their performance and how it could be improved. One aim of the Drama course is to develop the students' ability to evaluate their own work and that of others. Teamwork is another important skill; students need to be able to work effectively with others. Developing communication skills via performance is an important part of the course as well as expanding their vocabulary and interpretation of text and literary stories.

Assessment details: internal assessment during Autumn 2022	End of term assessments will be given by class teacher after each topic has been completed. For these assessments the student will receive a grade from A-E. Assessments in Drama are practical but students will be asked to complete a topic test as well as spelling test at the end of term. This allows the students to show their knowledge and understanding of the topics studied and the creative freedom to interpret characters, scripts and techniques explored.

Key skills required to complete this course:	Pupils will develop DT skills through three diverse projects per year. Pupils are given the opportunity to work with different materials and process either in the workshop, classroom or the computer suite. The projects are designed for pupils to develop an understanding their working properties and the tools and equipment required to manipulate each material. Finally, all pupils will develop their social and communication skills by working with each other during practical sessions and having consideration for health and safety.

This is to enable them to access the rest of the design curriculum. They will complete their project with their own project model maze game which demonstrates their woodworking skills and knowledge of the workshop machines/tools.





Passing, shooting, control and heading will be developed through small sided games and conditional situations Demonstrating high quality performances and accurate replication will be assessed
	They will be able to understand the concept of rugby, football and basketball and make effective evaluations of strengths and weaknesses of performance. Most will be able to suggest areas for improvement through Self & Peer coaching, 'what makes good' questioning/demos & targeted differentiated questioning). 
